

TRAINING SUMMARY

The New Mexico Rural Water Association is the premier training provider for small water system operators, providing quality instruction through federally-funded programs since 1978. We focus primarily on small water systems and have built an effective working relationship with operators through our programs and trainings. Association staff members are highly proficient at training and providing support to water operators and individuals seeking their certification.

Our staff works primarily with small water systems, and has 159 years of combined experience as certified water operators and 137 years of experience training water operators. Our hands-on capability and onsite presence lends credibility in a classroom setting and we are able to effectively follow through with students in ways other organizations cannot. NMRWA staff gives direct assistance to students struggling to pass the water certification exam by providing one-on-one instruction, small study groups, targeted homework assignments, mock exams, and moral support. Many small system water operators feel that they would not have passed their certification exam without the assistance of the New Mexico Rural Water Association.

PROGRAMS

NMRWA implements nine training and technical assistance programs with funding from USDA Rural Development, US Environmental Protection Agency, and the New Mexico Environment Department. Eleven full-time field staff members and four office staff implement these programs throughout the State of New Mexico.

NMRWA initiated two new programs in 2009, the ARRA Circuit Rider Program and the EPA Source Water Protection Program. In addition to these federally-funded programs, NMRWA offers fee-based services such as system mapping using GIS technology, water audits, specialized training, online certification training, advanced financial consulting, and engineering review.
